## WHO IS A CSA?

A Campus Security Authority (CSA) is an individual, who by virtue of their university responsibilities and under the Clery Act, is designated to receive and report criminal incidents to the University so that they may be included and published in the university's \_\_\_\_\_\_

- A member of the campus police or security department
- Responsible for campus security, but not a campus police officer
- An individual designated by the institution as someone to whom crimes should be reported
- Someone with significant responsibility for student and campus activities, including but not limited to, student
  housing, student discipline and campus judicial proceedings Examples: Athletic Directors, Athletic Coaches,
  Faculty advisors to student organizations, Resident Assistants, Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life.

## WHY SHOULD I REPORT?

The Clery Act requires colleges and universities to report campus crime data, support victims of violence, and publicly outline the policies and procedures they have put into place to improve campus safety.

## WHAT SHOULD I REPORT?

Criminal Offenses:

- Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter Any of the listed offenses, and incidents of 11.04T.u,(9r (s 12.yn)15.9
- Manslaughter by Negligence were motivated by the offender's bias.
- Sex Offenses (rape, fondling, incest statutory

rape)

Bias Categories:

- Arson
- Robbery
- Aggravated Assault
- Burglary
- Motor Vehicle Theft

- Disability
- Ethnicity
- Gender
- Gender Identity
- National Origin
- Race

Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Offenses: Religion

- Domestic Violence

Arrests and Referrals:

- Liquor Law Violations
- Drug Abuse Violations
- Weapons Law Violations

If you are unsure if a crime falls under one of these categories, report anyway!

Share exactly the information you receive from the reporting party. Detailed information will help the University classify and respond to the incident. This information can include, but is not limited to, the follows crime, but simply reporting the crime to
